
Behind the Scenes at Downton Abbey

JUST SOUTH OF CAPE COD, MASSACHUSETTS LIES THE TINY ISLAND OF NANTUCKET.

This exclusive seaport town boasts quintessential New England architecture influenced by the coastal style reminiscent of the 18th and 19th centuries. Perhaps one of the finest examples on the island is the Union Street Inn. Built in 1770, this former whaling captain's home has been recently refreshed and redesigned with the modern traveler in mind. After a comprehensive renovation project was completed in 2013, the classic Colonial now captures the essence of "Nantucket resort chic," providing a bright and fresh retreat for guests seeking the perfect coastal getaway.





row have struck the perfect balance between the iconic Nantucket Resort Style and a touch of romantic French elegance. Both Ken and Deborah have utilized their past experiences to coax new life from the 12 recently renovated guest rooms of the inn with luxurious linens, designer furnishings and fabrics. They are the best of both worlds with Ken's experience in hotel management at the Royalton in New York, coupled with Deb's retail management background with Fiorucci and Henri Bendel. Her behind-thescenes hostess work and his front desk smile blend perfectly to create a unique and memorable experience for their guests.

Union Street Inn is the only boutiquestyle hotel in Nantucket that offers a gourmet cooked-to-order breakfast. Along with a full breakfast menu, which can be served in bed at your request, guests might also find delectable treats such as homemade carrot cake, white chocolate chip and macadamia nut cookies, and double-chocolate brownies. In warmer weather, afternoon snacks are prepared and served on the garden patio with fresh coffee, tea or a glass of wine. The outdoor space was also redesigned

in 2013 by notable Nantucket landscaper Marty McGowan of the Sconset Gardener. The gardens are intimate and relaxing, with several places to sit and enjoy the generous green space.

New England interior designer Trudy Dujardin created the direction for the 2013 interior renovation, channeling the sophisticated vibe of Nantucket summer resort style. By utilizing classic blues, whites and yellows in updated designer patterns, the inn has been elevated to an elegant retreat while still maintaining the classically comfortable New England influence. The original wide-plank pine floors creak lovingly

underfoot, reminding guests their steps match those rich with nearly 250 years of history. New wallpaper was hung in several rooms, many in wide stripes. The collection of period furniture throughout the inn perfectly complements the contemporary pieces introduced into the décor scheme.

Several suites boast large, four-poster beds and wood burning fireplaces, while others have antique or beautifully upholstered headboards. Most rooms are flooded with natural light and all have been well appointed with custom tailored window treatments, matching box pleated bed skirts, and artwork inspired by the sea. Amenities include luxurious linens, duvets, bathrobes and bath products. Dujardin's vision is per-




fectly executed through each accent pillow and every well-placed accessory.

Nantucket is home to some of New England's best restaurants, specifically those owned and operated by husband-and-wife team Michael and Orla LaScola. Their restaurant American Seasons offers a playful take on classic nose-to-tail dishes and boasts an American wine selection of over 500 bottles. Opened in June of 2013, The Proprietors Bar & Table features Chef Tom Berry's menu, which focuses on locally caught seafood and farm-to-table vegetables.

With only a three-minute walk to the downtown area, the inn is just off of Main

Street and the harbor at Straight Wharf. Guests are only a few steps away from historic Nantucket's best dining, shopping, and local flair. Also close by are museums, art galleries and beaches as well as local activities such as fishing, biking and sailing. The inn's staff offers concierge service tailored to each guest's specific interests. Whether that might be a pottery or basket-making class taught by a local artisan, enjoying the freshest caught seafood, or having a locally brewed craft beer, it is all just a short stroll from Union Street Inn.

The inn was recently recognized by Fodor's as "One of the 10 Most Romantic Hotels in the U.S." and was voted "#1 Nantucket Inn" in 2012 by TripAdvisor.
