



## GRADUATED BOB

WHY TRY IT: "This versatile look flatters many face shapes and different age groups and can be classic and elegant or trendy and edgy."

'DO HOW-TO: Piece out the back with your fingers, then blow-dry for lift. In front, use a round brush to roll ends under, then smooth the sides. Apply a crème-based product and finger-rake for looseness. HAIR BY JEAN LOUIS DAVID FROM WINTER '09: '10 COLLECTION.

### TEXTURED LAYERS

WHY TRY IT: "This look is very 'in' this season because it's a modern way to spruce up last year's bob."

### DISCONNECTED BOB


WHY TRY IT: "It's very design-savvy. I'd recommend this for a client who likes to stand out and be different."

'DO HOW-TO: Using a round brush, roll out the ends of hair for a curled-under look. Work in smoothing crème to add texture in back, and mist with glossifying spray.

WHY TRY IT: "It's fun and very hipster!" 'DO HOW-TO: Use your hands and a big round brush as you blow-dry, creating forward movement. Then, define the layers with pomade. HAIR BY FABIEN PROVOST FOR FRANCK PROVOST FROM WINTER '09-'10 COLLECTION.





GEOMETRIC BOWL WHY TRY IT: "It's both edgy and trendy, from the overhanging section to the rich, multi-



# SHATTERED SHAPE

WHY TRY IT: "It's a modern version of what the asymmetrical bob was a year ago, which makes it more current."

'DO HOW-TO: Smooth out locks with a round brush, rolling the ends. Add definition to layers with pomade.



# TOUSLED SHAG

WHY TRY IT: "The shag is one cut that's stood the test of time—it's playful, carefree and very easy to maintain!"

"DO HOW-TO: Blow-out the bangs with a round brush. For the rest of the cut, work in styling crème and piece out layers with your fingers. HAIR BY FABIEN PROVOST FOR FRANCK PROVOST FROM ROMANCE GLAMOUR SUMMER '09 COLLECTION.

### MODERN FLIP

WHY TRY IT: "It's both modern and youthful, and it's easy to translate from day to night."

"DO HOW-TO: Curl back the front with a large-barrel iron. If you have long hair and want to play with a short style, pin up the length. Either way, finish with hairspray.

### ASYMMETRICAL PIXIE

WHY TRY IT: "This style works for the young woman who likes to have fun—it's fresh and funky."

'DO HOW-TO: Direct hair forward as you blow-dry with a round brush, flipping the ends out. Work pomade or styling crème through the front, smoothing the tips.
