

EUROPE

AUSTRIA VIENNA

Wiener Festwochen began in 1951 as a "demonstration of Austria's will to survive" post World War II. The ravaged city sought to prove that it could still engage in cultural activities. Today, the festival is more vital than ever despite serving a different function. As Vienna emerged as a cultural metropolis, Wiener Festwochen also evolved into an event more

focused on international cooperation. This year's multi-disciplinary program, set for May 14-June 20, features 51 productions from 23 countries including new additions of Othello c'est qui and Generacija 91-95. The event is an ever-changing project always searching for fresh, artistic takes, www.festwochen.at

BELGIUM BRUSSELS

What could possibly make the birthplace of Belgian beer, chocolates, and waffles even bet-

ter? Belgium Gay Pride, of course. This annual event, started in 1996, evolved from Antwerp's Pink Saturday gay pride observations honoring New York's Stonewall Riots. Last year, it livened up the city of Brussels with its Rainbow Village (complete with shops, open air cafés, and entertainment stages), from parade, and massive Pride parties. May 15 will mark a new edition with plenty of exciting events throughout the day. Take note. The week before Pride is Belgium's Rainbow Week, May 8-14, which includes festivities in several other

FRANCE CANNES

Only the Cannes Film Festival could find a way to be so glamorous for a good cause. ITALY VENICE

His work captured the zeitgeist of his time through the use of advertisements and words, which challenged established genres like concep-



tual art, surrealism, and post modernism. Ed Ruscha: 50 Years of Painting, at the Moderna Museet in Stockholm, journeys through the pioneer's works. After he moved to Los Angeles, Ruscha primarily worked on his paintings and left other art forms behind. The most famous of his paintings include his word portraits that range from early, basic pieces to more complex works in which he combines blocks of text or complete sentences with other subject matter. 
RIO DE JANEIRO






