### Spicing up brunch

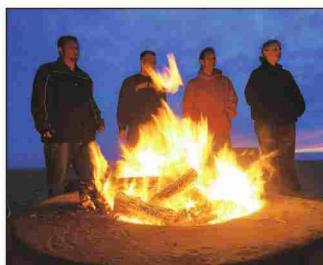


In Las Vegas, everything looks and feels flashier. Even Sunday brunch.
