NEW YORK

It's like restaurant week, but with spas. Established in 2004 to entice new customers, Spa Week, which runs tomorrow through April 20, will offer \$50 beauty and body treatments at over 150 New York spas. They include the Murray Hill Day Spa, Red Door (whose body melt treatment is pictured below), Supple Spa and Moonflower Spa. MONTREAL

The pianist Anton Kuerti will open the Montreal Chamber Music Festival (www.festivalmontreal.org), taking place from May 1 to 24 in the historic St. James United Church. The festival, which has a history of shaking up the staid image of chamber music by integrating it with other art forms (like dance or rock music), will feature upward of 80 artists this year. Scheduled musicians include the violinist Rachel



Barton Pine, who will present a program called "Mozart to Metallica"; the Janacek Trio from the Czech Republic; the hip-hop klezmer act Socalled; Solid State Breakdance, an all-female breakdance company; and the six-piece instrumental band, Bell Orchestre. Tickets range from 10 to 36 Canadian dollars, about the same in U.S. dollars.

NANTUCKET

The 12th Annual Nantucket Wine Festival, from May 14 to 18 (www.nantucketwinefestival.com), is adding a tasty touch: the Luncheon Symposia series will offer several one-hour symposiums with two to eight winemakers, who will then serve their wines at four-course luncheons. These include the Stars of Stag's Leap and the Soaring Wines of Spain. Other festival programs are Great Wines in Grand Houses, sit-down tastings in some of Nantucket's finest homes, and the signature event, the Grand Tasting, where more than 150 wineries will be represented. Ticket prices are \$50 to \$550; advance tickets to the grand tasting are \$85 a session.
